Speakers

Ms Kerry Fitzgerald

Kerry is Assistant Director in the National Data and Analysis Section, Department of Employment and Workplace Relations in Canberra. She was awarded a Masters by Research in criminology from the University of Canberra for her thesis on deterrence and deviance in recidivist drink drivers. She was awarded the University of Canberra Masters of Corporate Law prize in 1999 and a Churchill Fellowship in 2002. This Fellowship involved travel to several overseas countries to examine international responses to recidivist drink driving.

Dr Barry Watson

Barry is a Senior Lecturer with CARRS-Q, Queensland University of Technology, and is responsible for the development and delivery of courses in road safety and traffic psychology. Barry previously accumulated a wide range of experience in road safety research and policy development, arising from positions with the NSW Traffic Authority, the NRMA and Queensland Transport. Barry has conducted research into a wide range of road user safety issues and in 2004 completed a PhD on the topic of unlicensed driving.

Inspector Peter Mansfield

Peter is currently the Acting Superintendent at the State Traffic Support Branch within the Operations Support Command of the Queensland Police Service. His responsibilities include overall management of three distinct traffic portfolios, the Traffic Camera Office, Traffic Operations and Traffic Policy. This includes: overseeing the statewide operation of on-road camera and red light camera enforcement; managing QPS policy, training and support for breath analysis and non camera speed management; overseeing and implementing QPS traffic policy in general; overseeing the enforcement activities of the State Traffic Task Force and the investigation of serious traffic incidents by the Accident Investigation Squad. He has a Bachelor of Business and a Graduate Certificate (Police Management).

Ms Beth Stapleton

Beth is a Senior Manager (Policy) in the Land Transport and Safety Division of Queensland Transport and is responsible for Research and Innovation. Key activities in this area include data analysis, intelligent transport systems, mobile data, intelligent access, drug driving, drink driving, motorbike safety, the Multimodal ITS Strategy, the Impaired Driving Legislation Review and road safety/enforcement benefits of digital camera technologies. Beth has held research positions at Griffith University and Central Queensland University. She has a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) and a Bachelor of Applied Science (Applied Psychology) and is currently completing a Master of Business Administration. Beth is a member of the Australian Institute of Management, Institute of Public Administration and the Australasian College of Road Safety, of which she has also been an Executive Committee Member.

Professor Mary Sheehan

Mary is Director of the Centre for Accident Research and Road Safety at the Queensland University of Technology. Her research focus is the application of attitudinal and behavioural change strategies to community and population based interventions in the area of drinking and drink driving prevention. Mary was appointed an Officer in the Order of Australia in the 2003 Queen's Birthday Honours List for service to education and to public health through research work into the causes and prevention of road, work and social accidents in Australia, and through the development of community awareness programs raising the level of debate in the area. She is a member of the International Council on Alcohol, Drugs and Traffic Safety and was a member of the National Road Traffic Advisory Council from 1993-1995. Mary was elected a Fellow of the Australasian College of Road Safety in 2000 for her contribution and commitment to road safety.
