What is the purpose of the research?

The purpose of this project is to develop a better understanding of how cyclists' attitudes and perceptions about safety affect their riding behaviour. This information will be collected by asking cyclists to complete a questionnaire about their attitudes, perceptions and riding patterns.

Are you looking for people like me?

The research team is looking for participants who are 18 years and over who ride a bicycle at least once a month and live in Queensland.

What will you ask me to do?

Your participation will involve completing an online questionnaire which will take approximately 15 minutes of your time. A printed version of the questionnaire is available if you would prefer that format.

Are there any risks for me in taking part?

The research team does not believe there are any risks beyond normal day-to-day living associated with your participation in this research.

It should be noted that if you do agree to participate, you can withdraw from participation during the project without comment or penalty. Please note that you cannot withdraw once the data has been submitted because it cannot be identified.

Are there any benefits for me in taking part?

It is expected that this project will not benefit you directly. However, it will help to understand current patterns of cycling and safety issues and may inform future measures to improve cycling safety.

Will I be compensated for my time?

We would very much appreciate your participation in this research and although it is unlikely this project will benefit you directly, it may benefit future research into the safety of cycling. If you are a first year psychology student, you will receive ½ hour of course credit for your undergraduate psychology subjects.
