

## CARRS-Q HONOURS BURSARY - 2012 CONDITIONS OF THE BURSARY

1. The purpose of the scholarship is to help support a full or part time candidate undertaking an Honours program in the area of accident research or road safety within the Centre for Accident Research and Road Safety – Queensland (CARRS-Q) at QUT.
2. The scholarship is tenable over 2 semesters subject to the recipient's progress being deemed satisfactory and/or the recipient maintaining an appropriate GPA in any required coursework.
3. The value of the scholarship is \$3,000 per annum (to be paid at fortnightly instalments through the QUT Payroll system).
4. Where the recipient is being paid to study full-time, the recipient is required to commit not less than 40 hours per week, averaged over each semester of the candidacy, to the study being supported.
5. Paid employment must not interfere with the award holder's study program, and the University reserves the right to terminate the award of any recipient whose progress, as a result of additional paid work being undertaken, is not satisfactory.
6. On satisfactory completion of the Honours thesis the graduating student will submit to CARRS-Q a manuscript suitable for publication.
7. The selection criteria for awarding the bursary will be principally on GPA, followed by the research project topic and interest in the area. If the number of candidates is greater than the number of bursaries available the Centre Director reserves the right to take into account other aspects of undergraduate record and past experience.
8. Scholarship recipients will be required to adhere to the Intellectual Property Agreement of QUT.
9. Scholarship holders will be expected to undertake specified postgraduate coursework, and may participate in Centre seminars, Work in Progress meetings and general Centre meetings.
10. In the event of any concerns about the tax exempt status of the award, the recipient must consult the QUT Office of Research web page to clarify the situation. QUT can only pay a tax exempt scholarship to a full-time enrolled student. If a student is enrolled part-time, the scholarship will be taxable.
